"I have been an enthusiastic and passionate member at the Ecke YMCA for 45 years. As an avid half-marathoner, I enjoy the weekly Y running group, love swimming endless laps for refreshing the senses, build trust and friendships in the weight room on cardio machines, yoga and a variety of other fun classes. In March 2024, I was diagnosed with sudden onset of Guillain-Barre Syndrome, a rare neurological disorder in which the body's immune system attacks the nerves. The numbness, 100% paralysis and pain quickly spread throughout my entire body requiring intubation, a ventilator machine, a feeding tube, a tracheotomy and other life saving measures. After over 5 months in four medical centers, I am home but unable to walk or use my hands normally. My first goal was to return to the YMCA! The Y members have inspired, supported and pushed me along the way. The Y trainers and personnel have been caring and beyond helpful. They encourage me to believe that we are capable of doing more than we think is possible. This is not about me, but all of us together – enjoying the camaraderie that we share at the YMCA. 
