EUSD Launches First After-School Swim Lessons in Renovated Pool at Escondido YMCA

\$1.2 Million District Investment Supports Student Safety, Access, and Equity

Escondido, CA - The Escondido Union School District (EUSD) today launched its first after-school swim and water safety lessons in a newly refurbished pool located at the Escondido YMCA – A Campus for Community Well-Being. The pool reopening will allow EUSD elementary aged children, beginning with third grade, to participate in swimming and water safety lessons, many for the first time.

Closed since the COVID-19 pandemic, the pool was brought back to life through a \$1.2 million renovation funded by EUSD using state resources allocated for expanded learning and after-school programming. While the pool is located on YMCA property, the strategic initiative is district-driven, focused on delivering life-saving water safety education to Escondido students.

The program marks one of the largest school district-led swim safety efforts in the region, starting with elementary-aged students (beginning in third grade) who will participate in swim lessons during after-school hours. The first group of students includes participants from the YMCA's Expanded Learning Program (ELP), reflecting a shared commitment to equity, access, and safety for the district's highest-need youth.

"We are proud to partner with the YMCA as part of the district's broader commitment to providing meaningful and beneficial activities for our students," said Andrew McGuire, incoming superintendent of EUSD. "This initiative supports our long-term vision to increase student safety, expand enrichment opportunities, and invest in community well-being."

During the academic year, EUSD will transport students to the pool site by school, with plans for a full-day enrichment program during summer months. Future phases of the district's partnership with the YMCA will include access to nearby outdoor soccer fields, a farm-to-table instructional garden, a teaching kitchen, and outdoor activity zones - all located on green space between the YMCA's two main buildings on North Broadway.

"The YMCA of San Diego County has been actively engaged in Escondido and the surrounding communities for more than 60 years," said Ron Lelakes, executive director of the Escondido YMCA. "We're honored to partner with EUSD to host this important student-centered swim initiative on our campus. Together, we're creating a safe, supportive space where youth can gain life-saving skills and build confidence in the water."
